Dr. Matthew Georgis attended the Keck School of Medicine of the University of Southern California.



The Midwest Surgical Association (MSA) held its 2019 Annual Meeting on July 28-30 at the French Lick Springs Hotel in French Lick, Indiana. A number of contributions were made by Wayne State University personnel.

Dr. Solhee Lee (WSUGS 2022) presented a paper "Non-Operative Management (NOM) of Most Liver Injuries Impairs the Mastery of Intraoperative Hemostasis"; her coauthors were Dr. Anna Ledgerwood (WSUGS 1972), Dr. Joseph Buck (WSUGS 1987) from Ascension St. John Hospital, and Dr. Charles Lucas (WSU/GS 1962/67). Dr. Lee demonstrated that during the past six decades there has been a progressive decrease in the number of patients who require some type of intraopera-



tive hemostatic technique for the control of active bleeding. This decrease was due to the rise in NOM and also the rise in the number of patients who have a temporary pack during laparotomy but require no specific hemostatic technique to the liver after the temporary pack is removed prior to closure. The incidence of NOM/Ooeration only increased from about 46% in the 1960s to 83% in the 2010s. Dr. Lee recommended additional training for surgical residents planning to be involved in the treatment of bleeding liver injuries.

Dr. William Cirocco (WSUSOM 1985) presented a paper "It's Time to Retire Goodsall's Rule: The Midline Rule is a More Accurate Predictor for the True and Natural Course of an Anal Fistula." Dr. Cirocco presented a brief history of Dr. Goodsal who described the rule that has carried his name for over 100 year. Part of this rule states that the anal fistula external opening with close proximity to the anal cutaneous junction will arise, internally, on a radial line from the external opening. He demonstrated that this is not true and that most of these anterior external openings are associated with an

internal opening in the midline. Recognizing this to be true is helpful in preventing injury to the anal sphincter complex. This observation was especially true in women presenting with anal fistulas.

Dr. Chris Steffes (WSUGS 1993) was a coauthor along with Drs. T. Ivanics, S. Leonard-Murili, R. Shaw, and D. Kwon from the Henry Ford Hospital on a paper entitled "Outcomes of Various Treatment Sequencing Strategies in Octogenarians with Gastric Adenocarcinoma: A National Cancer Data Base analysis." These authors demonstrated that systemic chemotherapy represented a risk factor for mortality in octogenarians with stage I gastric cancer. They suggested that the utilization of postoperative systemic therapy be monitored carefully in octogenarians with significant comorbidities.

Dr. Sheel Patel (WSUGS 2021) presented a poster entitled "Cardiac Metastasis: A Rare Finding of Marjolin Ulcers"; her coauthors were Dr. James Tyburski (WSUGS 1992) and Dr. Heather Dolman (WSU/GS 2000/06). They described a patient who had a huge 20cm Marjolin ulcer after a prior burn to the flank and back. This patient had excision of this lesion but later developed some systemic symptoms and, on postmortem examination, was found to have metastasis of this Marjolin adenocar-

Dr. Kimberly R. Coughlin (WSUSOM 2016) presented a poster "Changes in Injury Characteristics and Outcomes of Gunshot Wounds at a High Volume Urban Trauma Center from 2004-2017"; her coauthors were Drs. Hayward and E. Edhayan from the Ascension St. John Hospital. Dr. Coughlin had demonstrated that the average age of patients with GSW has increased as has the likelihood of there being multi-region injuries. This resulted in an increase in the overall mortality.

Dr. Al Baylor (WSUGS 2005), Dr. Arthur Carlin (WSU/GS 1991/98), Dr. Heather Dolman (WSU/GS 2000/06), and Dr. Jonathan Saxe (WSUGS 1990) serve as counselors for the MSA.

The next meeting of the MSA will occur on August 2-4, 2020, at the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island in Michigan.


