

Opportunity for Alumni to mentor WSUSOM students at community clinics

Wayne State University School of Medicine (SOM) offers medical students service-learning opportunities. These clinician-supervised exceptional educational experiences focus on responding to community-identified concerns, including student preparation and student reflection in compliance with LCME requirements. Examples of these activities include overseeing students assessing blood pressure, providing simple health tips for adults age 60+ who participate in the Detroit River Walkers program, etc. Another opportunity is participating in the Community Homeless Interprofessional Program (CHIP) clinic.

Clinical mentors provide oversight of these community opportunities. Most opportunities are about 2 hours. See more info below.
