In addition, she is a clinical affiliate of Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts and Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia.

In her current position, Dr. Parekh works alongside the APA leadership to meet the needs of 37,000 members worldwide and to ensure mental health equity for all and especially minority and disadvantaged populations. Dr. Parekh is also the Director and Principle Investigator for the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services (SAMHSA) Grant supporting the APA's Minority Fellowship and Medical Student Programs. Under her leadership, APA awards over 50 minority residents and 30 minority medical students yearly. Her division works collaboratively with external partners such as federal agencies, state entities, training institutions and communities to enhance the delivery of cultural competent mental health and reduce mental health

disparities. Among programs initiated under her direction include early pipeline programs for populations underrepresented in medicine (URMs), mental health disparities programs and educational resources to aid multidisciplinary mental health providers.

Dr. Parekh is co-author of the e-book <u>Overcoming Prejudice in the Workplace</u> (Harvard Health Publishers, 2012). She is also editor of <u>The Massachusetts General Hospital Textbook on Diversity and Cultural Sensitivity</u> (Springer Publishers, 2013) and co-editor of the textbooks titled <u>Cultural Sensitivity in Child and Adolescent Mental Health</u> (MGH Academy Press, 2016) and <u>Stigma and Prejudice: Touchstones in Understanding Diversity in Health Care</u>(Springer Publishers, 2016). Dr. Parekh has led trainings and lectured nationally and internationally on topics including diversity, cultural psychiatry, mediation, negotiation, child and adolescent psychiatry, substance use and psychopharmacology. In 2016, She was recently an invited to present Grand Rounds at Wayne State University School of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry by Richard Balon, MD.

I recommend Dr. Parekh highly for this distinguished award. As an alum of Wayne State University School of Medicine too, I believe her career success is reflective of the education and inspiration garnered during her decade as a member of the WSU community. This award is a nod to continue her work in the fields of mental health, health care disparities and diversity/inclusion.
